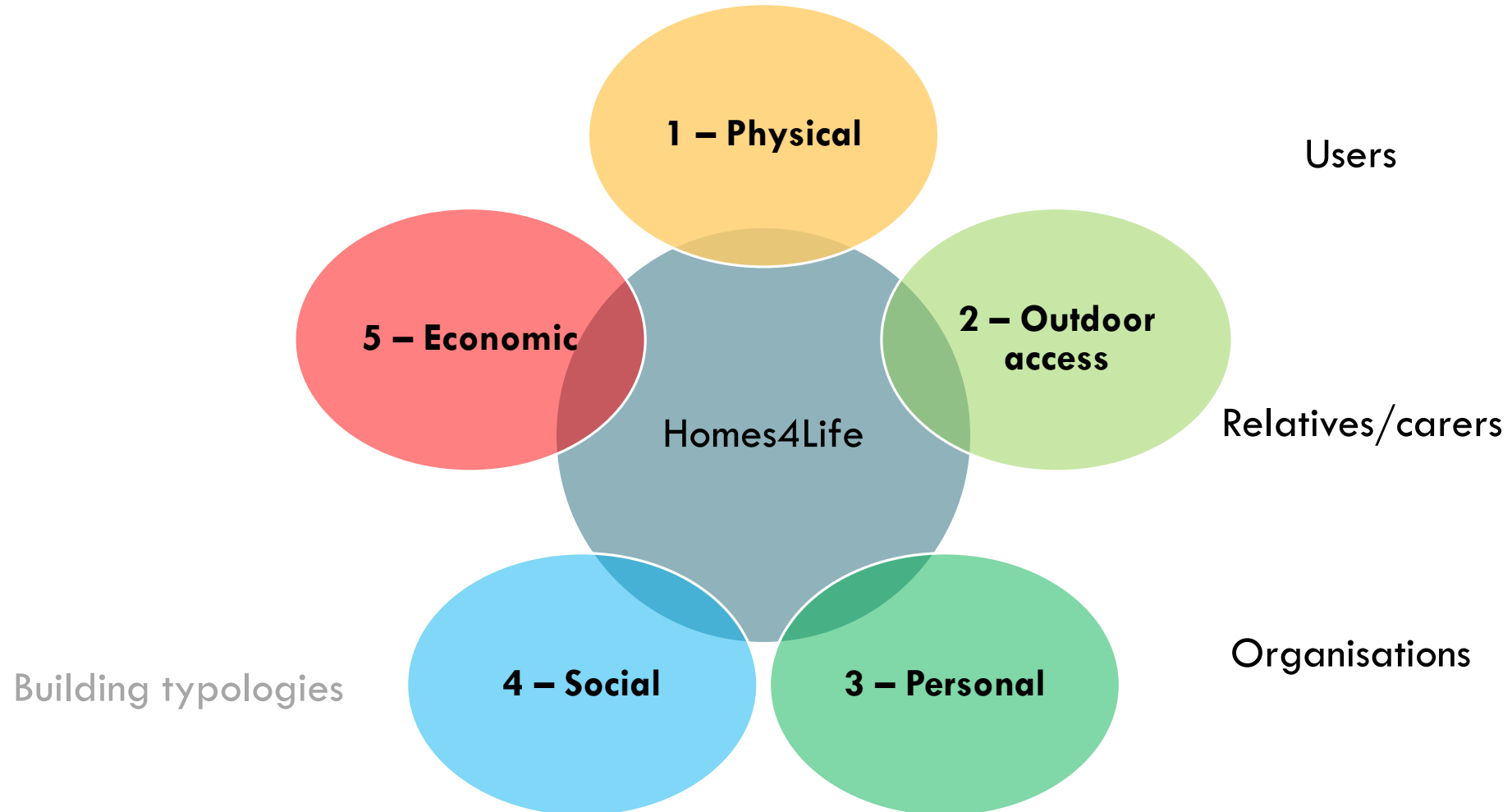


Areas of special interest

- Where certification can help to generate impact



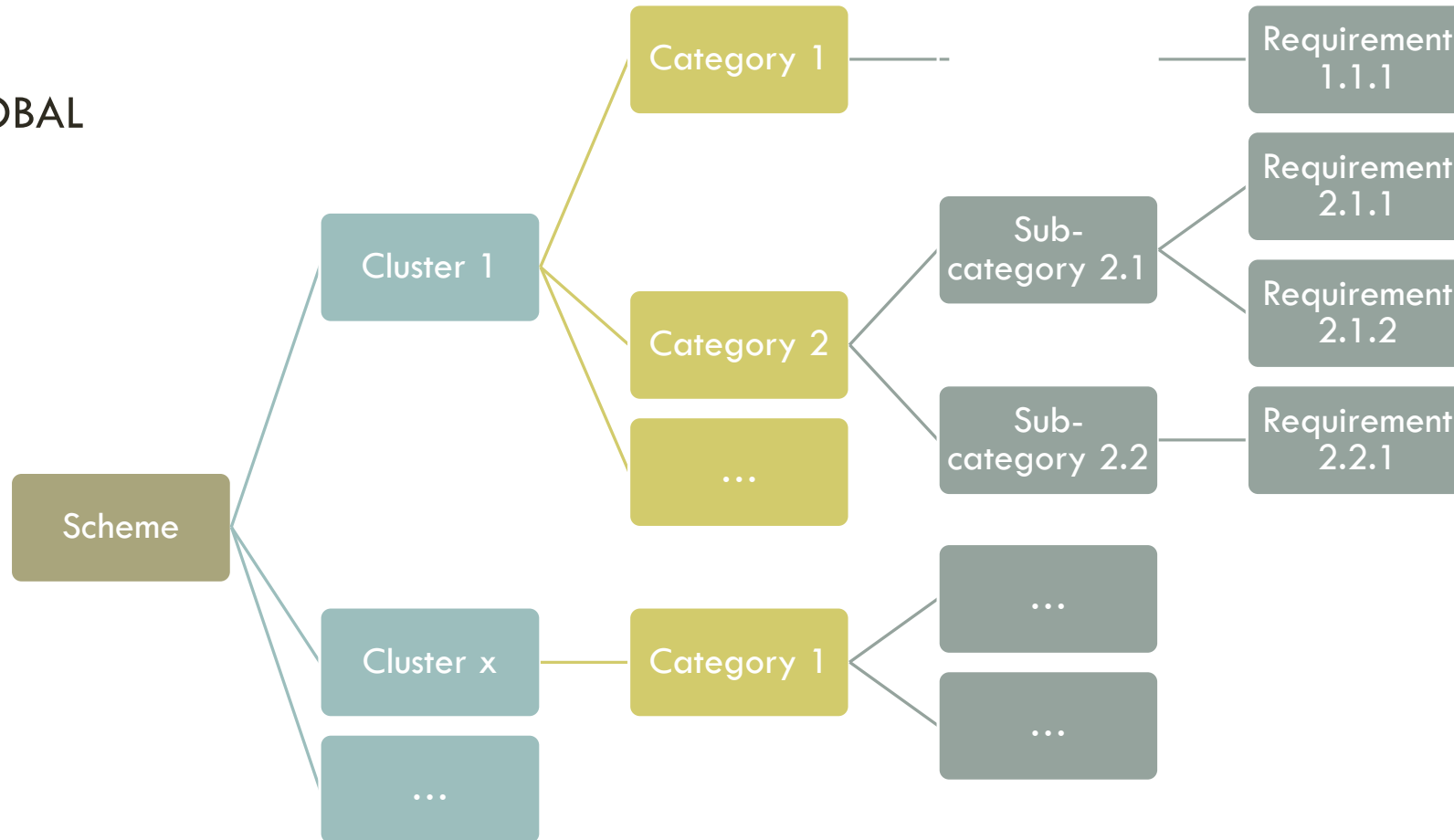
GENERAL STRUCTURE H4L FROM TAXONOMY





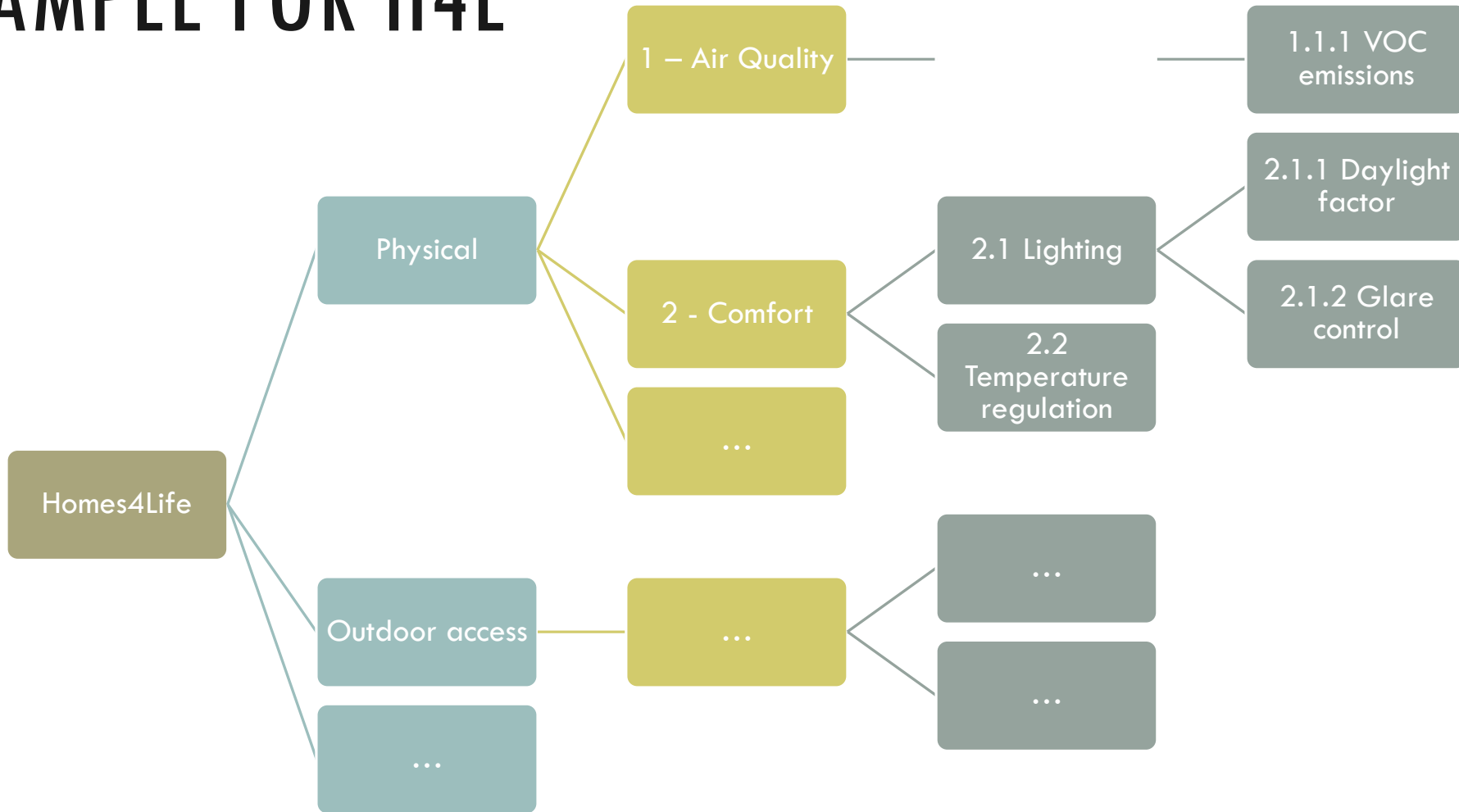
CERTIFICATION SCHEMES

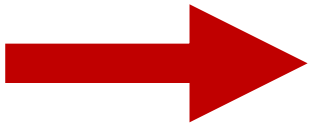
