Home functions


- HARD: personal safety, comfort, accessibility & orientation, health & social care, outdoor access

WORKING TAXONOMY






"the basic idea for both the taxonomy and the KPI-framework is a MATRIX, with NoPs (short for Needs and Preferences) and KPIs defined at intersections"


